MOOCS — Massive Open Online Courses

If you go to www.futurelearn.com, you will find taster courses from universities all over the world giving you an insight into what studying a subject at university will be like.

The courses usually last between 2-6 weeks and require 2-6 hours of studying per week. They are completely free of charge.

Research Topic: Blood Cancer

It is claimed that someone is diagnosed with blood cancer every 14 seconds. There are over 100 different types of them. 240,000 people in the UK are currently living with one of them and every year 15,000 die as a result of one.

Those caused by the creation of too many white blood cells called granulocytes are being combated with drugs called TKI (Tyrosine Kinase Inhibitors).

Myeloma is also being combated with CAR-T therapies, which involve taking a person's immune cells from their bone marrow, reprogramming them to target their cancer and returning them to the patient.
