For those engaged in research questions from home access via the internet offers a tsunami of material – what are the questions to ask:

Are they reliable/ Are they relevant / how can I use them?

Full Fact is the UK's independent fact checking charity that securitises the claims made in the public media and on social platforms.

False or misleading information can come in many forms: from viral posts on social media, to comments made by public figures, to statements printed or broadcast by journalists.

For example , Full Fact are working to fact check and correct misinformation on Covid-19 whether on Facebook, after all coronavirus has nothing to do with 5G, or skewered reporting that omits the context of the news. There's a lot of misinformation about Covid-19, so Full Fact is sharing its top tips on how to check if a claim is true. Be informed.
